Congratulations to Danny Troutman **for being inducted into the** **Carolina UPHA Hall of Fame**

Tonight's inductee into the NC UPHA Hall of Fame grew up in Statesville, NC. As luck would have it, his parents purchased a house right across the street from Mr. Hubert Foster who owned and ran Skyuka Stables. Danny and Mr. Foster's grandson, Steve Hanks became best of friends with both of them spending many hours racing and training the Foster ponies. One money making scheme the little entrepreneurs created was to sell rides on the ponies to neighborhood kids. After a very profitable afternoon of selling rides for a quarter, the pair headed home across the field, when something spooked the ponies and they took off running, spilling quarters everywhere.



Danny grew up in a family that was 5 generations of blacksmiths. He worked with his dad in the blacksmith/welding shop all through high school, but he had no interest in becoming a 6th generation blacksmith; he loved training and showing saddlebreds and that was the direction his life took.

While in high school, he and his friend Steve Hanks could be found at a horse show almost every weekend from spring to fall. They did all their own grooming, sleeping in the stalls, and would take turns showing the horses all through North Carolina.

It was after high school that Danny decided once and for all to become a horse trainer. He had been working a few horses after work, but he decided to become a full time trainer and went to work for Bill Becker at Spring Valley Farm in Columbia, SC. Owner, Mr Perry had many World's Champions in his show string and Danny felt he learned a lot by working with Bill Becker.

Next he went to work for Paul Payne in Statesville. Paul was a talented trainer that had a definite gift for promoting and selling saddlebreds, so most of the horses they trained were young horses that belonged to Paul and they sold horses constantly. Danny learned a lot from Paul and felt his time there was invaluable.

When Paul Payne passed away from cancer, Danny went to work for Larry Barbee in Locust, NC. So many wonderful horses and young trainers got their start at the Larry Barbee stables and once again Danny was working talented young horses, showing some clients' horses and selling, selling, selling.

After 3 years with Larry, Danny felt it was time to venture out on his own and he leased the Rogers barn in Taylorsville opening the Danny Troutman Stables.

It was while he was training in Taylorsville that he took horses to the Wytheville horse show and there he met his wife, Nancy. She loved the horse business as much as he did and after taking horses to the Roanoke Valley horse show in 1982, they decided to purchase her family's farm in Salem, Va. and move the training operation to Virginia.

On August 1, 1983, Danny and Nancy opened Meadow Wood Stable Inc and are still training and showing in Salem.

Some of Danny's favorite horses include his road horse Thunder Road, and road ponies Regal's Citation and Stat.



Danny has been a UPHA member for too many years to mention, acting as chapter chairman 3 times and being the Chapter 18 Horseman of the Year. He served on the ASHAV board of directors or as an officer for 22 continuous years and received the ASHAV Service Award. He also was inducted into the ASHAV Hall of Fame in 2004.

ASHAV 2013 Hall of Fame Bobbie Camper Fisher



This is the story of a woman who has had a 64-year love affair with horses. Bobbie Camper Fisher is the daughter of the late Randy & Gladys Howell, the wife of Ray Fisher and stepmother of Terrie Fisher.

The story began at age three when her dad took her to ride the ponies at Fat's Dalton Pony rides in Roanoke. From the first ride she was hooked! Mr. Howell bought her a black and white pony called Little Miss Trixie. For Bobbie's first horse show they took her to the Bedford Horse Show. The afternoon class was a disaster. She didn't care because she got to show for the very first time. Claude Shiflet was the judge and must have felt sorry for her as he tried to teach her canter leads between the afternoon and evening shows. That was the beginning of Bobbie's horse show career.

The late George Moore was a friend of the family and he encouraged Mr. Howell to buy Bobbie a real show horse. So her dad bought her a little walk-trot mare. She needed to have her tail cut, so they took her to the late Thurman Crowder's farm located in Bennett Springs. Mr. Crowder cut her tail and cared for her while she recuperated. As many of you know, Mr. Crowder was the father of Nancy Troutman and the farm is now known as Meadow Wood Stables.

Bobbie has shown many horses in her show career; horses such as Star of Stars, Stunning Lady Genesis, Gracious Fashion, Fascinating Ways and Valley Dream. But her two all time favorites were Sport's Captain and Desdemona's Happy Denmark.

In her senior year at Northside High School she began teaching a few lessons. After graduation she started training horses while attending Business College.

Her training business started with a seven-stall barn. Her father built a new 10-stall barn with a tack room, wash rack and office. He put a load of hay in the loft and one load of shavings in and told her it was her graduation gift. Now it was up to her whether she would be a success or failure and so Lakeland Stables was born.

Bobbie added ten more stalls and a harness room. The last and best structure built at Lakeland was the indoor 204 by 48 foot arena. The lesson program flourished. She had 60-75 students in each session, summer & winter. She has taught hundreds over the years, third and fourth generations in some families!

The stalls soon filled up with training horses. Some of the notable horses and riders were: Valiant Successor and owner Jane Ellen Cranwell, who was the 1984 Juvenile 3-Gaited Champion at Madison Square Garden in New York City, Tiffany's Fifth Avenue owned by Connie Collier and shown by Colleen Speno who was the 14-17 World's Champion and Reserve World's Champion of Champions 3-Gaited Pony and Kathryn Repass riding Kimberly's Camaro who won the 8 & Under Equitation Championship at Lexington Junior League in just her third show and only a month later she went on to win the Reserve World's Championship in the 10 & Under Equitation Division, and this was the first time she cantered at a show!

After 38 years in the business Bobbie decided to retire. Lakeland Stables was sold in 2002 to Saint Francis of Assisi Service Dog Foundation. They are carrying on the legacy of helping people and animals.

Bobbie and Ray now reside on a small farm at the foot of the Blue Ridge Mountains with a horse named Hannah, a black Lab name Precious and three cats. Bobbie states: "I've had a wonderful life with horses and it just doesn't get any better than this."

Janet Sterba and her husband, Jeff, first got into Saddlebreds in 1981 while living in New Mexico. They found an ad in the newspaper for an American Saddlebred and decided to go look. As they pulled up, the horse's owner was walking her to the barn. The mare threw her tail up over her back and snorted. They fell in love with the breed from that day forward.

They were very active in the Saddlebred Association of New Mexico through the 80's and 90's, keeping their horses at home and enjoying the sport as a family (adding daughter Katy in 1985 and son Dane in 1987). In fact, Janet showed her first 5-Gaited horse while pregnant with daughter Katy. It's no wonder Katy loves the horses, she was practically born on one!

In 1998 the Sterba's moved to Maryland and began to show in Virginia and Pennsylvania. It was so much fun, they bought a farm in Virginia in 1999 and started a public training barn named Seven Oaks Stable with John Champagne as trainer. In 2005, they sold the farm and moved their horses to Grey Ridge Farm in Kentucky, then to their current home at Mercer Springs Farm with trainers Smith, Alexandra and Sandy Lilly.



Janet has been privileged to own some wonderful horses over the years; WC Open Arms, WC Take It From the Top, WC Pass With Care, RWC Simply Amazing, RWC Undulata's Optical Illusion, RWC My Stiletto, Worth Afame, She's A Starburst and Horace Taft are some of her favorites.

Janet has come a long way from the 10-year-old kid at the rodeo in New Mexico holding a raffle ticket in hopes of winning the spotted pony!!

Our recipient this evening embodies everything that the sportsmanship award defines: graciousness, fairness and sincerity. Janet is always there to lead a helping hand to a dear friend or a complete stranger in need. Win or lose, she always appreciates the experience and simply enjoys her beloved American Saddlebreds no matter the color of the ribbon.

Spotlight on Youth

Jamie Houck of Roanoke has been a very busy girl. She has spent the last 6 months preparing with the horse, Champion Stevie Nicks, for the opportunity of a life time.

Jamie rides American Saddlebred horses at Meadow Wood Stables in Salem. She recently qualified for, and showed at, the biggest show for the breed, the World's Championship Horse Show. It is a week-long show where horses from all over the world compete for top honors in their divisions.

Jamie has received top honors at every show she has competed in this year, including the Roanoke Valley Horse Show. With the support of her parents, Kevin and Kim Houck, she made the journey to Louisville, Kentucky with her trainers, Danny and Nancy Troutman, owners of Meadow Wood Stables.

She did not go expecting to win but to simply have the experience of showing at the World's Championship Horse Show. Little did she know that, once again, top honors would be coming her way. Jamie received a second place ribbon in her division, a huge accomplishment for anyone much less a 14 year old in their first year of showing in the big leagues.

Dickey Davis Honored for Breeding Excellence

Dickey Davis was born in 1944 on a farm that had horses and ponies. He started riding at the age of three and started showing pleasure ponies at the age of six. In 1950 he then broke the ponies to drive and started showing them in Shetland classes.

In 1955, Dickey's father went to Peoria, Ill., and bought a long tail Hackney pony, King Citation, which was one of the first Hackney ponies in the Southeast. Citation showed in the harness pony division, winning everywhere he went.

Dickey continued showing roadsters, harness and cob tail ponies. His father went to Kentucky and bought the 5-gaited pony Vicky Flynn. In 1959 Vicky Flynn and Dickey were Reserve World's Champions.

When he started school at Virginia Tech he worked horses at Billy Maddy's barn in Christiansburg. He bought a 5-gaited mare, Sweet Sharon that he showed in gaited classes until he sold her to a client in South Africa.



In 1969 Dickey's family built the training barn known as Fort Chiswell Stables. Dave Becker trained there for several years. During this period many nice show horses were developed. After Becker left, Ivan Tester came and trained for the Davis family. Dickey showed in amateur classes for Ivan. After Ivan left, Dickey moved to the training position around 1979. Dickey started training outside horses as well as his own.

In 1982 Dickey was diagnosed with lymphoma. Harry Gilmore took on the training duties while he was taking treatments for two years.

In 1992 he purchased Royal Memories. In 1993 after a spinal cord injury, Dickey bred Royal Memories to Supreme Heir resulting in the colt Mountain Empire. Then in 1995, he bred her to Attache's Liquid Assets resulting in the stud colt Attache's Royal Assets. He bought several American Saddlebred broodmares and started breeding his own mares as well as outside mares to the two stallions. Attache's Royal Assets' first crop of foals produced the yearling Fort Chiswell's Premiere (Thomas Edison) who he sold to Karen Waldron. Both stallions have produced many World Champions, Reserve Champions and Kentucky State Fair ribbon winners. He has built his broodmare band to where he has the largest breeding program in the Southeastern part of the United States. Last year, Attache's Royal Asset was ranked seventh in Saddle Horse Report's Overall World's Champion Sire Rating.

This year's winner embodies all of these characteristics and more. She graduated from Holy Cross Regional Catholic School in June of 2013 and is currently a freshman, attending Randolph College, in pursuit of a pre-med degree, in hopes of attending medical school.



A faithful member of ASHAV, this year's recipient began riding when she was eleven years old and rose through the academy ranks on Margaret Gardiner's lesson horses. Glenwood's Charisma was the first American Saddlebred purchased for her and she showed the mare in Junior Exhibitor Show Pleasure classes. On her fifteenth birthday our recipient moved on to a new mare, An Heir of Grace. She showed Grace in equitation, show pleasure, country pleasure and three-gaited classes. She currently shows Madeir's Maverick in amateur three-gaited and Imperial Asset in amateur five-gaited.

She has worked diligently to support her equine endeavor, from assisting in the preparation for upcoming shows to spending countless hours helping with the instruction of up and coming riders. She continues to share her knowledge of the breed with younger riders with the hopes of increasing the number of exhibitors in the show ring; striving to encourage others to reach their own full potential and to try and achieve their horseback riding dreams.

The ASHAV scholarship committee could not have chosen a more rounded young woman, who has not only served and supported many grass root shows and ASHAV, but has also received above average grades, a member of the National Honor Society and treasurer of the Holy Cross Key Club, as well as treasurer of her freshman and senior class. She has been a standout athlete in Baseball, Volleyball, Tennis, Softball and Cheerleading; acting as team captain and earning numerous accolades such as playing in the Blue Ridge Conference in multiple sports, receiving Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year, acting as a member of multiple All-Tournament Teams, receiving her varsity letter, voted Best All-Around Player and receiving the Coaches Award and Spirit and Sportsmanship Award.

While not only riding and playing on multiple sports' teams, our winner has been an office aide, teacher's assistant, president of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, a published poet, Page for the city of Lynchburg voting stations and voted Holy Cross' Homecoming Princess.

Southern States' Special Horse Organization Winners (SHOW) Program helps turn empty feed bags into cash for horse-related organizations. Nonprofit breed associations and horse clubs are eligible. Currently more than 300 groups are earning money through the SHOW Program.

Here's how it works:

Register your organization with **Southern States** in Richmond, VA, then get everyone to clip and save the proof-of-purchase seals found on the back of each bag of feed purchased at a Southern States store. For bulk feed purchases, submit the customer copy of the delivery ticket. For every bag of Legends or Triple Crown feed, your organization will receive 25 cents, and \$10 per ton on delivered bulk feed. Reliance feeds are also included at a smaller rebate amount.

ASHAV YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP

ASHAV offers a scholarship to one or two individuals, depending upon the number of applicants, for each college or university school year. The completed application, attached transcripts and tax information are due on the desk of the Scholarship Chairman no later than April 30 of the year you wish to receive the scholarship. Letters of reference are also due by April 30.

The individual applying should be 21 years of age and under, at grade 11 or higher, who demonstrates financial need, a commitment to the American Saddlebred industry and academic success.

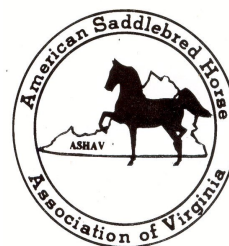

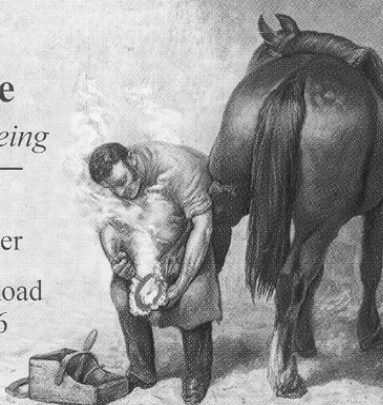

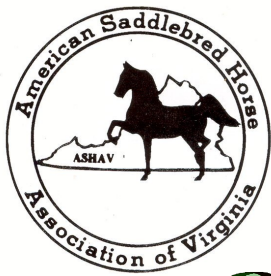
