Trey Prasse Perpetual Trophy

Trey Prasse was born January 28, 1988, in Huntington, WV. He will always be remembered for his special connection to horses and his love of riding and training. He competed very successfully in Hunters/Jumper, Dressage, and Western, but American Saddlebreds were his favorite horses.

Trey started his show career in Saddleseat Leadline when he was 5 years old. At age 7, as his mother was preparing for a show in Portsmouth, OH, Trey informed her that HE wanted to ride in the show. Joan explained that that would be great, except that he would have to first learn how to post the trot. Minutes later, here came Trey trotting around the barn, posting beautifully, and 3 weeks later he was Reserve Champion in the 8 and Under Walk-Trot Equitation at Portsmouth! He went on to win numerous Equitation classes in KY, OH, and VA.

Trey began showing in ASHAV Futurities at age 11. Many of you will remember the “Trey Tumble” in his very first Old Dominion Weanling futurity class. Just after trotting through the gate, “Paradocs Genie” bumped into Trey, knocking him down. There was a loud gasp from the crowd, then applause as the little boy jumped up and without even brushing himself off, continued running down the rail with the colt. Naturally, this made “Genie” show off even better, so the crowd responded enthusiastically as they trotted back and posed in front of the judges. The pair placed 4th in a huge class of weanlings, where the rest of the handlers were at least a decade or two older and a foot taller than Trey...And he was hooked on futurities!

Guided and inspired by Fred Sarver and Smith Lilly, Trey demonstrated a knack for training and presenting young horses both in-hand and under-saddle. From 2000 to 2014, he won over 30 Championships or Reserve Championships in Futurity classes in VA, NC, and WV, mostly with horses he bred, raised and trained himself. In his last ASHAV futurity class, Trey won the 2014 Two Year Old Three-Gaited Championship, riding “Paradocs Outfoxed.”

Trey was also a gifted musician, guitarist, and song-writer. Those who followed his Facebook rants knew him to be a very conservative political thinker. He was an excellent farrier, learning from his mentor, Dick Coffman, and shod all the Paradocs horses after Mr. Coffman’s retirement.

A member of Zoar Baptist Church, Trey was a believer who liked to share the Word of God with others. On his wandering path, Trey touched many lives. Many have known his kindness and generosity. Robert H. Prasse, III (“Trey”) died Monday, November 17, 2014, after a brief illness. Trey was survived by his parents, Doctors Joan and Robert Prasse, his sister and brother-in-law, Dr. Shauna Riggs and husband Joshua, and brother Christopher Prasse.

Since their move to Virginia in 1998, exhibiting at the annual ASHAV Horse Show has been a cherished tradition for the Prasse family. The friendships formed and memories made here will always be treasured. Breeding and training American Saddlebreds at Paradocs Farm, and showing in the Futurities, has been a labor of love. The Prasses hope that this perpetual trophy will honor Trey’s life as it commemorates the current and future winners of the ASHAV Two Year Old Three Gaited Futurity.

Trey’s smile, humor, and many talents will be missed. “A light that should have shown brightly has flickered and gone out much too soon.”

This Year's Scholarship Recipient **Miss Kathleen Anne Hall**

The ASHAV scholarship committee searches for a scholarship applicant that is 21 years of age and under, at grade 11 or higher, who demonstrates financial need, a commitment to the American Saddlebred industry and academic success.

This year's winner embodies all of these characteristics and more. She graduated from Hidden Valley High School in June of 2016 and is currently a freshman at Roanoke College, majoring in Chemistry.

Riding since the age of five, she has grown up showing in multiple American Saddlebred divisions and currently shows *A Temper Tantrum* in juvenile equitation.

Over the last 13 years, our winner is proud to have always ridden with Meadow Wood Stables in Roanoke, VA. She appreciates the fact that she has always had an exceptional support system and barn family. While riding with Meadow Wood she has had the opportunity to show Danny Ocean in Juvenile Gaited Pleasure and April Foolin' You in Juvenile Country Pleasure. For the last five years, our winner has been riding and showing her 9 year old mare, Temper; enjoying Juvenile Park Pleasure, show pleasure and equitation classes.

Her positive attitude, maturity and intelligence make her a role model for all ages. She has worked diligently to support her equine endeavor; from assisting in the preparation for upcoming shows, participating and helping Nancy Troutman, for several summers, with the Meadow Wood Stables' horse camps, to spending countless hours immersing herself in the world of a horse trainer, for an entire summer. Our hard working winner not only enjoys the show ring, but can often be found, "behind the scenes." From cleaning stalls, washing and braiding tails, grooming and tacking horses, cleaning, and feeding. She helps with all the barn and farm chores that must be done, but no one wants to necessarily volunteer for; the jobs that support the entire structure and grease the wheels of the horse industry.

She has been an active youth of ASHAV, selling raffle tickets and "flying pigs" and has helped raise money in several performances, during the ASHAV convention's lip syncing competitions.

The ASHAV Scholarship Committee could not have chosen a more rounded young woman. She has not only served and supported many grass root shows, the United Professional Horsemen's Association, the United States Equestrian Federation and ASHAV, and attended the ASHA Annual Convention and Youth Conference but was also Secretary of the Science National Honor Society and member of the Beta Club, German Club and the National German Honor Society. She not only ran on her high school's cross country team but also played lacrosse and ran indoor and outdoor track. During all of her volunteering, club officer positions, and sports, she maintained a 3.9 GPA.

While attending Roanoke College she is pursuing her degree in Chemistry, joined an intramural soccer team, Club LAX for lacrosse and a member of the Adventure Club. Our recipient thanks ASHAV for introducing her to volunteering, teaching her the importance of helping out and fueling her desire to help others.

Even though her future goals include the Peace Corp and a possible future as a Special Agent with the FBI, she plans to keep horses a part of her life, for as long as she is able; hoping to continue her support of ASHAV and staying involved in the horse show world. She has said that, "after long summer days at the barn and peaceful trail rides in the fall, that [her] love for horses will be a forever part of [her] life." In her college essay our winner wrote, "one of the best parts about showing horses is feeling the powerful animal beneath me and knowing that she loves it just as much as I do"

ASHAV is honored to recognize such an upstanding citizen, a young lady that truly has a passionate love of horses and this year's scholarship recipient. We wish her much success in all her future endeavors.

2016 ASHAV Hall of Fame Inductee: Joe Shortt

It is a great pleasure to honor one of the region's greatest champions of the American Saddlebred horse. Tonight we induct Joe Shortt into the ASHAV Hall of Fame.

Throughout his life, Joe has:

Shown,
Trained,
Bred, and
Promoted the breed.

His wife, Joan, has been at his side throughout his Saddlebred career. Joe began riding at age six on a Shetland named Nubbins. He showed Nubbins for the first time the next year at the Rich Valley Fair, a local show in Smyth County. Joe showed several ponies and horses throughout his youth and had great success on his three-gaited pony, Susan Sensation, and was rarely defeated on his pleasure pony, Golden Boy. In high school, he worked several summers at Nancy Brown's Brownford stable and then opened a 20 stall training barn at Seven Mile Ford in 1971 while still attending college at Emory and Henry.

Joe continued training horses throughout the seventies and trained many champions, including:

Prince Magic
Drum Chant
Bourbon's Curiosity
Katy Vanguard
Boomerang
Holiday's Rambling Shannon,
Blue Chips, and many more.

His greatest achievement during this time was the purchase of a two year-old three-gaited pony prospect from Blythewood Farm in 1972. The pony's name was Command's Ego. The first year was a real challenge: he had to both break and train Command's Ego while teaching the boy, Craig Barbow, to ride at the same time. Two years of hard work with Command's Ego and Craig led to great success. In 1974, they won the championship at Roanoke and the World Championship at Louisville.

They also won at Knoxville, Raleigh, and Atlanta.

Joe added 'auctioneer' to his resume in 1978 when he completed Mendenhall's School of Auctioneering and founded Dixie Sales with partners Thad Williams and Bill Pierce. They conducted spring and fall Saddlebred sales at Saltville and Dublin, then moved the sales to the Dixie Farm and Sales Center in Boones Mill. They also leased Debbie Foley's Silver Brook Manor Farm and held a Saddlebred sale in conjunction with the World Championship Horse Show.

Joe had been working with APG LIME Corporation while training, showing, and serving as auctioneer. In 1980, his professional responsibilities at APG LIME required him to downsize his training operation. Joe began focusing on his breeding program and stood four stallions:

Mataca Guy
Mainstream
Drum Chant, and
Careless Sultan

In 1986, APG LIME promoted Joe and relocated him to Roanoke. He left his training and breeding career, but remained active in the Saddlebred community. He served on the ASHAV Board of Directors and as Vice President for many years. In this role, Joe championed the breed and ensured that the Saddlebred community had opportunities to show and share their beloved horse.

Joe retired from APG LIME in 2002. Joe and Joan now enjoy retirement in Sevierville, Tennessee. They continue to love the American Saddlebred horse and treasure the memories and friendships of their life-long involvement in the Saddlebred community.

2016 Inductee to the ASHAV Hall of Fame: Brenda Pulis

This 2016 inductee to the ASHAV Hall of Fame was first introduced to the American Saddlebred Horse working as an assistant to the president, and later as a board member of the Greenville Horse Show in Greenville, South Carolina. She began horseback riding lessons with Mary Sandzen at Cleveland Park Stables. Her first horse was a walk/trot named Bourbon's Bo Jangles, on whom she won her first blue ribbon.

Her husband's job transfer took the family to the Roanoke, Virginia, area. During the next six years she was instructed by Allen and Bobbie Camper at Lakeland Stables, and briefly showed a walk/trot named Highland Spring's Premier. She worked two years during this period for Saddle & Bridle, but took a break for full time motherhood. During this period she was elected treasurer of ASHAV, and participated in the founding of the ASHAV Horse Show.

The family next moved to Fayetteville, North Carolina. She returned to the employ of Saddle & Bridle. She came under the guidance of Liz McBride Jones, at that time the riding instructor at G & I Broodmare Farm in nearby Raeford. During this period she acquired a three year old named Once For Free that she showed in pleasure driving. Over the next five years she showed a succession of five-gaited horses including CH Jac Lu Mar's Mountain Contract, It's The Berries and Stuff'N Nonsense.

The last 15 years have been a whirlwind. With Peter and Kim Cowart at the Westwind Stables in Statesville, North Carolina, she showed her all-time favorite 3-Gaited mare, Spool's Top Star RHF. She has recently transitioned back to pleasure driving with CH Emmy Night.

Chris Thompson of Saddle & Bridle has this to say about our inductee: Brenda is absolutely the best at what she does. Whether its a huge show or a small show she covers them all the same, with professionalism and care. She's an exhibitor and a fan of the breed and always will be. "She has always been a Champion of ASHAV and the ASHAV Horse Show." Congratulations to Brenda for this honor!

ASHAV Hall Of Fame 2016 – Ceil and Kenny Wheeler

The ASHAV Hall of Fame focuses on a lifelong commitment to the Saddlebred Horse industry, and you would be hard-pressed to find individuals more fitting than 2016 inductees Ceil and Kenny Wheeler.

Kenny was born into a family of horse lovers. His father, Kenneth Wheeler Sr., is a renowned hunter trainer, while his mother, the late Sallie Busch Wheeler, built Cismont Manor Farm into a major player in the Saddlebred and hunter worlds during the mid-1960's. A myriad of world's champion hackney ponies joined the string in the 1970's with young Kenny driving to World Championships with the great road pony, Speed Limit.

Ceil also started at a young age. She began taking saddleseat riding lessons at the age of 4, the youngest student Virginia Intermont College had ever accepted. Ceil and her sister Cyndy showed Saddlebreds all over southwest Virginia and eastern Tennessee through the 1970's and 80's.

After graduating from East Tennessee State University, Ceil returned to the family farm and began to train and teach riding lessons. Her riding program grew to over 60 students with a barn full of training horses.

Ceil and Kenny first met on the Virginia show circuit in the early 1990's. They later married and this team began their journey to become two of the finest, most passionate ambassadors for the American Saddlebred industry. The couple moved to Keswick, where Ceil continued to train Saddlebreds at historic Cismont Manor farm, while Kenny was working for a local Anheuser-Busch distributorship. They moved to Arkansas where they lived for nine years before returning to Keswick and purchasing East Belmont Farm where they live today.

Their daughters, Catherine and Sallie-Mason, have continued on in the family tradition as world champion equestrians. The two have shown in equine events ranging from the green shavings of Louisville to hunter jumpers and foxhunts in Virginia. Ceil and Kenny are justifiably proud of the girls' dedication to their horse endeavors.

The list of World Championships won by the Wheeler Family is extensive and includes such horses as: Strapless, Summer Sweet, Fancy Ribbons, Joe Friday, Memories Paragon, Work It, Amelia Heircat, Desert's Supreme Kid, The Mighty Moe, Pucker Up, CH Swing An Singin, Callaways' Born For This, Simbara's Sweet Lorraine, Wooly Bully, Caraway's New York Minute, Nuttin But Talk, Cheers to You, Kentucky Proud, Callaway's Naughty and Nice, Victoria Lynn, Runaway, Whassup (a son of friend Larry Hartsock's stallion, Exalted Effect), Bodidly, Callaway's Brioni and 11 times World Champion Walterway's Remember Me.

The Wheeler family has associated with some of the greats of the horse world like Jim B. and Jimmy Robertson, Gib Marcucci, Bill Robinson, Dr. Alan Raun, Randy and Denessa Harper, John Shea, Nelson Green, John and Tammie Conatser, Mike Tunstall and Smith, Alexandra and Sandy Lilly.

Kenny currently serves on the Board of the ASHA working to support the breed. The Wheelers are major supporters of the ASB Museum and in their many sponsorships of horse shows large and small.

The Wheelers are gracious, welcoming and caring. Their lifelong commitment has been and will continue to be a driving force for our industry, striving to make it better.

Please join me in congratulating Ceil and Kenny on their induction into the ASHAV Hall of Fame.


Download all four parts of the application from the ASHAV website or feel free to contact the Scholarship Chairman by using the contact information found below.





Register your organization with **Southern States** in Richmond, VA, then get everyone to clip and save the proof-of-purchase seals found on the back of each bag of feed purchased at a Southern States store. For bulk feed purchases, submit the customer copy of the delivery ticket. For every bag of Legends or Triple Crown feed, your organization will receive 25 cents, and \$10 per ton on delivered bulk feed. Reliance feeds are also included at a smaller rebate amount.


